The Centre for Medieval Studies at the University of Toronto has an international reputation, resting on the wide-ranging interests of its faculty, the calibre and preparation of its graduates, and its outstanding library facilities.



The Centre offers several non-credit summer Latin courses facilitated by senior CMS doctoral students who are thoroughly fluent in Latin and experienced Teaching Assistants and Course Instructors.

Working under the supervision of Medieval Latin faculty members, your Summer Latin instructor is trained specifically to teach these courses in depth.

Students who have successfully completed Summer Latin course requirements will be provided with a letter detailing the course content and their participation. They may also sit the September Latin Examinations with CMS, and they will receive a Statement of Proficiency detailing the significance and content upon achieving a passing grade.

For students with basic knowledge of Latin to learn additional grammatical commentary and analysis, and gain experience in reading texts.

Level II Latin

JULY 2 - AUGUST 8 -in person-

M - F 10:30 am - 12:00 pm

Prepares students for Latin fluency with a thorough command of grammar, complex sentences, and a wide vocabulary. Students who successfully complete Beginning Latin will have gained basic knowledge of the elements of Latin, including declensions and conjugations, some vocabulary and syntax.

Beginning Latin Review offers students an opportunity to consolidate their grasp of the language. Assignments will include selections from the Vulgate, the *Gesta Romanorum*, and other medieval texts of a similar difficulty level.

Level I Latin Review serves as a grammar refresher course prior to delving in to Level I Latin readings and coursework.

Level I Latin coursework encompasses Latin texts of various periods, countries of origin, and disciplinary interest, with emphasis on close grammatical commentary and analysis, and with some opportunity for supervised translation of sight passages.

Level II Latin coursework includes regular sight passages and prepared reading of difficult Medieval Latin preparing students to effectively use Latin for research purposes.
